
Your Hotel Austria as backdrop for a glamorous photo-shooting

“Vienna – up close and personal!”



This time, take a closer and more accurate “magnifying lens”-look: the **Greek Orthodox Church at the Fleischmarkt**.

Greek merchants have already lived in Vienna before the first Crusade. In the nobility, contact between the Greeks and the Austrians go back a long way up to the Middle Ages. The **Greek-Orthodox community of the Holy Trinity had been founded after a decree of the Emperor Josef II in 1787** and at the same time, the community received permission to erect a church with the same name at the Fleischmarkt.

From the outside you will immediately spot the façade in **Byzantine style**, which is probably unique to Vienna, the interior has been designed in the same style as well. Have a close-up look and admire the oriental splendour, the artfully fabricated wooden bishop throne and the lectern of the pulpit. Since 1963, the Church of the Holy Trinity has been the cathedral of the Greek-Orthodox Metropolitans of Austria.

Swirling into the 2008/09 Ball Season



Vienna’s ball season is unique. When else can you experience the State Opera “backstage”, see the Vienna Philharmonic take to the dance floor, or take a “fiacre shuttle” to a coffeehouse?

Vienna hosts more than 300 balls every year, exuberantly celebrating the fasching carnival season. And it is not only the traditional waltz you will hear – contemporary sounds also feature. The **Opera Ball** at the Vienna State Opera (Feb 19, 2009) is something of a legend. This occasion provides the unique opportunity to view the opera house on the Ring Boulevard both from the auditorium and, as it were, “backstage”, rubbing shoulders with stars from the world of music.

The **Vienna Philharmonic** hosts its very own ball at the Musikverein (Jan 22, 2009). Yet only during the opening ceremony will you see the members of this world-famous orchestra with their musical instruments. Thereafter it is, for once, their turn to waltz the night away.

The **Coffeehouse Owners' Ball** (Feb 13, 2009) is deemed particularly atmospheric. Every year it attracts some 5,000 visitors to the Redoutensäle and Hofburg Palace. Afterwards, many guests choose to draw the night to a close at Café Landtmann where they are taken in traditional style by "fiacre shuttle".

On Gold Ground

Gold-ground paintings, as they are referred to in art-historical circles, featured in the Princely Collections from their inception. Now a temporary exhibition is being devoted to these early Italian paintings in their own right.

Around 40 works of art dating from between 1325 and 1520, including paintings by Bernardo Daddi, Lorenzo Monaco, Giovanni di Paolo, Sassetta, Bartolomeo Vivarini and Liberale da Verona, demonstrate both the development of Italian painting from the Gothic and early Renaissance as well as the rich variety of subjects from these epochs. The choice and combination of these works takes in virtually all the important Italian artistic landscapes of those times – from Upper Italy in the north to Naples in the south, the latter still under strong French influence – but does not claim to be comprehensive. Paintings from Tuscany, in particular those from Siena and Florence, constitute the core of the exhibition.



In terms of subject, the works on display range from small winged altar-pieces with several panels which have been preserved in their original form, variations on the Virgin Mary enthroned with Child which evolved during the course of the 14th and 15th century and small-scale panels of saints which once formed part of larger altar ensembles, to rare secular subjects such as the representation of three episodes from a Tristan cycle. The main focus, however, lies on religious painting.

Rudolf – Affaire Mayerling

Anyone who adored ELISABETH will love RUDOLF: from 26th February 2009 onwards 24 musicians of the orchestra of the VEREINIGTE BÜHNEN WIEN and 32 performers will be bringing the story of RUDOLF



to life every evening on the stage of the Raimund Theater.

RUDOLF is the story of a visionary and the central themes are passion, self-denial and the courage of a human being who possessed all the skills of a political thinker but none of the skills for power. His ideas could have changed the world of the ossifying Habsburg empire, his ardour could have ushered in a new era. But the inflexibility of court life and his adversary, the prime minister Taaffe, prevented any modernisation. In this soul-destroying situation Rudolf met the love of his life: Mary Vetsera. Her attitudes and her refusal to compromise gave him the strength to take the final step – to Mayerling – “united in love until death”.

The Hungarian production of this show was premiered in 2006, in Hungarian, at the Operettszínház in Budapest. In the summer of the same year the show was staged at the open air festival in Szeged. Now the Viennese version of RUDOLF is coming to Vienna on 26th February 2009 and the German-language premiere will take place at the Raimund Theater.



Resonances 2009 - Music from the Middle Ages to the Baroque Era

The festival of Ancient Music invites you to take a musical journey through time, with authentic sounds from the Middle Ages to the baroque (17 - 25 January 2009).

«Pleasure gardens» are the motto of the «Resonanzen» Festival 2009 which will take audiences on a fantasy-filled stroll through gardens, both real and imaginary, symbolic and mythological. Like the pleasure garden, music was part of an economical system of art and entertainment that sought to appeal not only to the ear, but to all the other senses as well.
